Indoors: Quintessentially California modern, this single-story house centers on a combined living-and-dining room with an open-beamed, white-painted wood ceiling and a wall of glass that overlooks a large front deck. The flooring was replaced by the owner and is a hard-surface laminate that resembles wood. To the right of the front door is an open galley kitchen with white cabinets and stainless steel appliances. A gray-painted brick fireplace climbs the wall opposite the entrance; next to it is a dining area with an inset window creating a nook for indoor greenery.

The two bedrooms are at the rear of the house; each has parquet floors and direct access to a patio. In one bedroom, pocket doors open to private bathroom that contains a vanity with double vessel sinks, a closet with sliding mirrored doors and a stone-tiled bathtub with a shower head. The second bedroom has use of a hall bathroom with a combined tub and shower faced in pale green glass tile.

Outdoor space: The landscaping features palms and crepe myrtle. Terraced gravel and garden beds rise from the rear patio up the hillside. Off-street parking is in a driveway.
